



Quran Studies

Year 8 are currently studying surah Tariq and the connection with modern science. The word طَّارِقِ translated by early Commentators of Quran as عطَّارِق as such, taken for a name as "Morning star" "Bright Star" or as "Night comer." While the literal meaning of طَّارِقِ is "one who knocks at the door." The verse has the capacity that it gives new meaning as per our modern understanding of science.

A star was discovered in the sky in 1976, then they were given the name of "Pulsars." Pulsars are among the strangest object in the universe. One way to think of a Pulsar is like a light house. We see Pulsars turn on and off as the beam sweeps over Earth. It is because of the pulsation and rhythmic beam of the star that scientists gave this name. The word Pulse and pulsate means to beat or to beat a strong regular rhythm. What a miracle of the Quran that it says in verse 2 of Surah Tariq that it is a star. year 8 pupils listened to the Audio samples of the star beam/signals and were surprised that the star emitted a sound like someone knocking at your door. The Miracle of surah Tariq amazes the pupils. As, the star has a beam and produces the sound of door-knocking by a human just as the literal translation of the word.





In order to encourage memorisation of the holy Quran amongst our student. We take part in annual competitions.

Listening to Quran is a sunnah and one of the easiest deeds you can do to receive Allah's blessings. Learning and listening to the Quran is made easy these days with a lot of digital and physical resources to learn Quran, both online and offline. Some pupils were gifted with Quran lamps and Quran head set at the school. Aside from that, it turns out that listening to the Quran gives a lot of benefits to your body and soul.

Travelling home alone - NSPCC advice

- Make sure they know their address and your telephone number by heart, in case they
 get lost or have to navigate home from somewhere new.
- If they have a mobile phone, remind them to fully charge it before leaving the house, and make sure they have all your contact numbers saved.
- Talk to them about road safety. They should always look both ways before crossing the street, and never be on their phone whilst crossing a road.
- Remind them never to accept a lift from someone they don't know, or let a stranger into the house. They should never give personal information away – in real life or online.
- Remind them that if they feel unsafe or uncomfortable at any time, they can call you or a trusted adult.
- If they ever feel like they're in immediate danger, they should call the police straight away on 999.

- Pupils to bring their own earphones as part of required equipment.
 - Pupils are still required to bring own prayer mats.

Children who miss school, miss lessons. These lessons are not repeated, so children will have gaps in their learning. Additionally, if a child misses a lesson they can miss the foundation to subsequent lessons.
